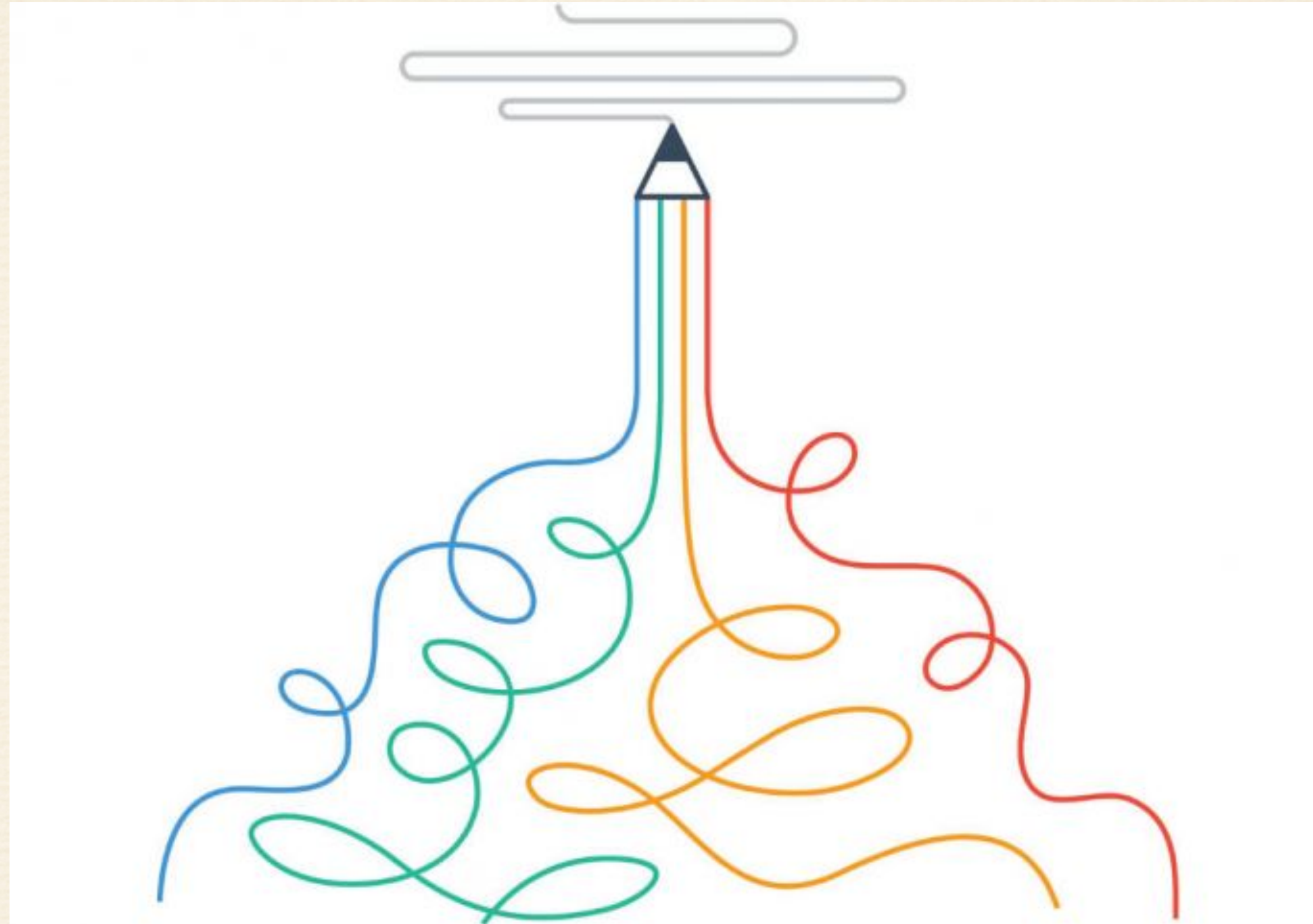

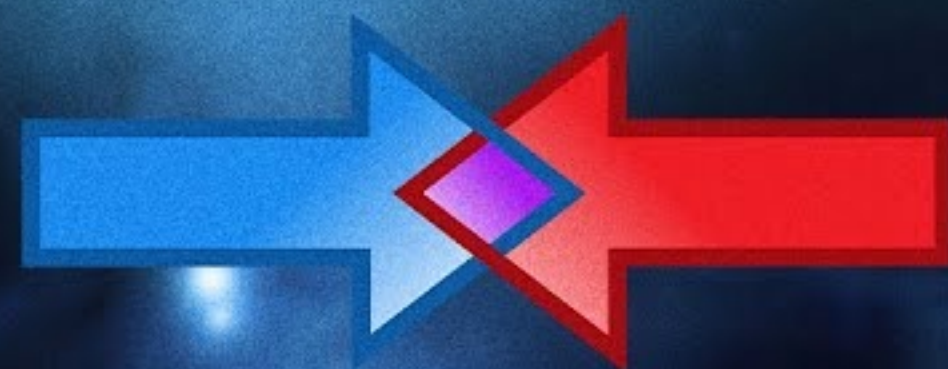
- ❖ Make a list of main idea that support the thesis statement. Each main idea becomes the main idea sentence for a body paragraph.
