Choose a specific topic



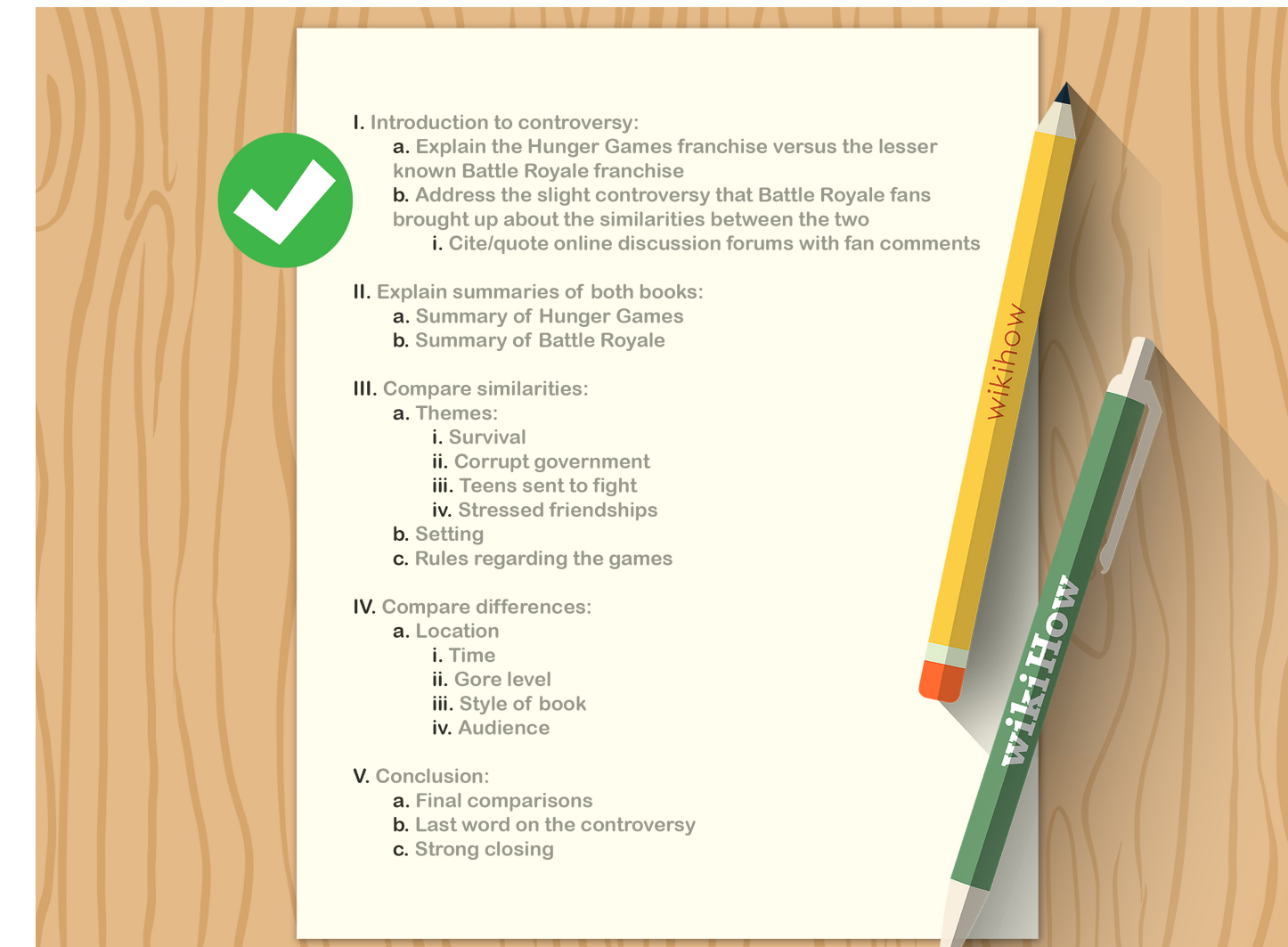
Settle on the purpose of the essay before you begin outlining or writing.

Compile information



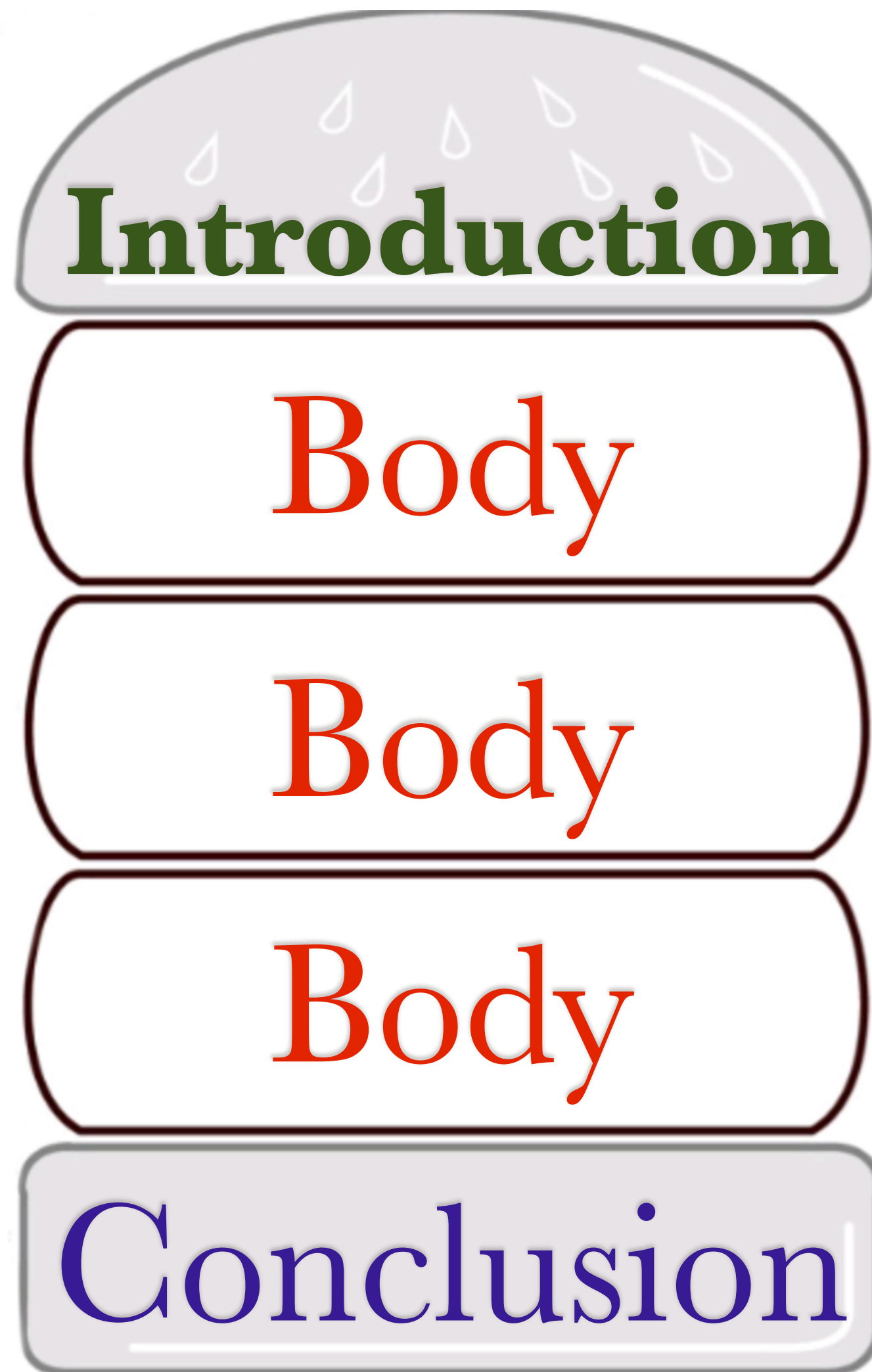
The best essays are full of detail—names, dates, physical characteristics, background information, and sensory information that can help implant your main points in your reader's mind.

Make an outline



Your writing must be organized. Group your main points into individual body paragraphs, each of which should be a subcategory of your essay's main topic.

Essay format



Write an introductory paragraph

A good introductory paragraph can be a road map for your entire essay.

Try to capture the reader's attention.

Write body paragraphs

Each body paragraph should begin with **a topic sentence** that anchors the reader's attention and tells them what to expect from the paragraph. Be as specific as possible without overwhelming your reader with information.

Conclusion paragraph

Recap your ideas
