PERSUASIVE ESSAY

WHAT?

<u>Persuasive writing</u> is writing that tries to convince a reader to do something or to believe what you believe about a certain topic.

PURPOSE

- Support cause
- > Urge people to action
- Make a change
- > Prove something wrong or true

PRE WRITING

Know your audience

Who will read your writing? Who do you need to convince?

The audience may be your friends, your teacher, your parents, your boss, or the readers of a newspaper!

Will you be graded? On What?

Should you be casual or professional?

PRE WRITING

Pick a side

The writer must clearly state his position and stay with that position.

Generally, the position is stated in the opening paragraph or introduction. (This is your opinion sentence)

PRE WRITING

Make a plan, then write

- 1. Introduction/Hook/Thesis
- 2. Body 1 with support
- 3. Body 2 with support
- 4. Show the counter-argument and make an argument against it
- 5. Conclusion

INTRODUCTION

The hook

The writer provides a personal experience or made-up situation to introduce the position.

The writer gives an interesting piece of information to grab the reader's attention.

You could begin with a strong statement

You could start with a fact or statistic

You could start with a question

Open with outrageous statement

BODY

The supporting paragraphs

First reason with specific examples.

Second reason with specific examples.

Third reason with specific examples.

CONCLUSION

Wraps up the writing

Summarize your main points.

End using one or more of the following strategies:

- -Call the reader to action
- -provide a solution
- -Make a Prediction

The last paragraph wraps up the writing and gives the reader something to think about.
